Superintendent's Message

Dear Holton Community:

I hope your summer has been filled with fun and included many memories with those you love! We are very excited to get our school year started! This year we are looking forward to connecting our students with amazing learning opportunities, supporting their leadership skills, creating an environment where everyone feels like they belong, and celebrating the achievements of the outstanding young people we serve. We have so much to be proud of as a community and we are ready to join together and make this the best school year possible. This year is also the last year of the district's five year strategic plan. We will be developing a process to update the strategic plan and will be seeking your input to build a new five year vision for the district! More information to come on this. I have a few updates to share with you as we approach the start of the year:

UPDATED WEBSITE: We recently went through our entire website to improve navigation and the process to find information. We are still working on several areas that need content to be added. This effort is to make our website an easy way to get information about the district, contact staff, and learn more about all of the programs and resources available. I hope you find some time to check out the changes at <u>www.holtonschools.com</u>. If you have any questions or feedback, feel free to contact me!

UPDATED SCHOOL SECURITY: We have upgraded our public address system. The new PA system includes outdoor speakers, increased access for making announcements, and the ability to make district-wide announcements. This upgrade will allow us to better utilize the PA system and help us communicate quickly during an emergency. Also, as soon as the new cameras arrive, we will update and add several security cameras. This will provide improved coverage and help support the safety and security of the district. Both of these projects are funded using state allocated school safety funds and our county Technology and Security Enhancement funds.

UPDATED SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR: The school calendar for the year can be found at <u>https://www.holtonschools.</u> <u>com/downloads/administration/2023-2024_calendar_2.pdf</u>. The calendar once again includes Early Release in our schedule. These Early Releases allow our staff to engage in ongoing collaboration and professional development. We know this can create a child care issue for our families. 1st-8th grade students are able to sign up for Project Focus, our afterschool program, and engage in academic support and enrichment activities. You can learn more about Project Focus below.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER SUPPORT: We are excited to continue to have Deputy Lindahl supporting the district as our School Resource Officer. This year, Deputy Lindahl will have a cell phone and that phone number will be shared with our students, families, and community as another way to report safety concerns or ask for help. More details about the phone will be shared soon. The School Resource Officer position is partially supported by the fiscal year 2023 grant funds awarded by the state of Michigan and administered by the Michigan State Police. This position is also funded through a partnership with Blue Lake Township, Cedar Creek Township, and Holton Public Schools. I am very thankful for these partnerships that allow for our district to have Deputy Lindahl serve our school district!

HACKLEY COMMUNITY CARE - SCHOOL NURSE: We are thrilled to add a School Nurse to the services offered by Hackley Community Care at Holton Public Schools. The School Nurse will serve students in K-12 with a variety of health care services including point of care testing for flu, strep, and COVID-19 as well as healthcare support for students with long term health care needs. More information will be available soon including how to sign up so your child can access the nurse and how to contact the nurse!

PROJECT <u>FOCUS</u>: Project Focus, our afterschool program, will continue this year. This is a great program for students to receive extra academic support in grades 1st-8th. You can sign your child up for this program at our District Open House on August 23 from 4-7PM or by contacting the elementary program coordinator, Lisa Barnes, at: <u>lbarnes@holton.k12.mi.us</u> or the middle school program coordinator, Lexi Freed, at: <u>afreed@holton.k12.mi.us</u>.

BEFORE SCHOOL CARE: Enrollment is available for our Before School Daycare for Preschool- 6th Grade students. This is operated by Lighthouse Learning Centers, a program of White Lake Area Community Education. The Before School Daycare provides childcare at the District Services Building from 6:30AM until the start of the school day. SUMMER SCHOOL

As summer is winding down and we are looking toward the start of a new school year, we want to share some of the many wonderful opportunities students that participated in the Holton Summer Learning Program experienced. Holton Public Schools has continued to partner with True North and the Project FOCUS team to bring our elementary and middle school students a six week summer program that provides an incredible journey of learning and growth, and we are thrilled to share its impact with you.

Summer break allows students to explore, discover, and enrich their knowledge in new and exciting ways. Our Summer Learning Program is designed to offer small class sizes and a targeted focus on continuing academic progress for our students. This summer eight teachers and eight Project FOCUS staff supported nearly 100 students with academic skill development and enrichment. Our Summer Learning Program incorporated hands-on activities, interactive projects, and field trips that brought learning to life.

This summer elementary students participated in fun activities designed around the theme of Fairy Tales. The primary activity that grounded the students and teachers together was collectively reading the book "Kenny and the Dragon" by Tony DiTerlizzi. Each student received a copy of the book as they read along. They celebrated the end of story by enjoying a serving of the dragon's favorite dessert, crème brûlée, which was prepared by Holton Elementary's very own music teacher/pastry chef, Ms. Culler. Additionally, Project FOCUS offered the elementary students two field trips. Students had the opportunity to attend the Mid-Michigan Enchanted Forest Festival in Frankenmuth where "fairy tales come to life." Students also visited Shedd Aquarium in Chicago followed by a royal banquet and jousting tournament at the Medieval Times dinner theater.

The theme for the middle school was Outer Space. They learned about the solar system, constellations, rockets, and so much more! They each received a copy of the book "Wish," by Barbara O'Connor which they read together throughout the summer. Field trips included a visit to Camp Miniwanca for team building challenges and survival skills lessons. They also enjoyed a ferry ride to Mackinac Island where they explored and learned about the history, culture, and nature of

KINDERGARTEN OPTIONS

For the 2023-2024 school year, Holton Elementary will continue to offer two options for our new Kindergarten students! There will continue to be traditional Kindergarten classrooms, as well as a transitional Kindergarten classroom. As the academic expectations of Kindergarten increase, it has been shown that some children need more time to grow socially and emotionally before they are completely ready for traditional Kindergarten. There is strong research to support delaying the heavy academic demands for some children leads to much more confident learners.

For this reason, the transitional Kindergarten class will continue for the 2023 school year. The transitional Kindergarten class is a two-year experience for students who can use the extra time. The first year will be in the transitional Kindergarten classroom using a curriculum that focuses on a play-based experience and allows them to become curious and confident learners. The second year, students would enroll in a traditional, academic Kindergarten classroom.

If you have a child that will be five before December 1st, 2023 and you are interested in traditional Kindergarten or transitional Kindergarten, please call the elementary office at 231-821-1826.



The Holton Elementary School Wellness Program (SWP) will continue to provide Mental Health services and are adding Nursing services. Please join us in welcoming Amanda Giddings, RN, to our Hackley Community Care (HCC) team at Holton. She comes to us with years of nursing experience and a long Holton community presence.

Amanda's office is located in the elementary school office across the hall from the HCC Mental Health Provider. She will provide health services for grades K-12 full time during the school year to include screening, nursing assessments, case findings, immunization assessments and administration, first aid for minor injuries, chronic care interventions, blood pressure and glucose monitoring, health education, case coordination and interventions under physicians standing orders. Unique to Holton SWP, point of care testing for COVID, Flu and Strep and telehealth visits will be offered to parents for patients to connect with a Teen Health Center provider for an appointment if warranted. Initially, elementary age children will have access to Amanda and Middle School/High School students can walk over for scheduled appointments throughout the day. The nurse's room in the Elementary building will be completed by the start of the school year and construction of a nurse's room in the Middle/High School will begin shortly after the beginning of the school year. We look forward to serving your students with this new nursing service and welcome your input and support of this great program. MEDICATION POLICY

Parents are to come to the office and request medication forms. These forms must be completed by the parent/ guardian and by the child's physician. <u>Parents/guardians</u> <u>must bring the completed forms along with the</u> <u>medication their child needs, to the school office.</u> Students are NOT allowed to bring medications to school. A student in possession of drugs (illegal OR prescription) will be disciplined according to language located in the handbooks. RIGHT TO KNOW

Holton Public Schools operates Title I programs at Holton Elementary School and at Holton Middle School. You may request the following information about the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s):

- 1) Whether the teacher has met Michigan licensing requirements for the grade level(s) and the subject area(s) in which the teacher provides instruction;
- 2 Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status through which Michigan licensing requirements have been waived;
- 3) The teacher's college degree(s), major(s), and field(s) of discipline, as well as any graduate degree or certification that he or she may have earned.

In addition to this information about your child's teacher(s), you may also request this information about any paraprofessional who provides Title I services to your child.

REQUEST FOR NOTIFICATION OF PESTICIDE APPLICATION

Holton Public Schools either contracts with private vendors or applies its own pesticides within district facilities and on their grounds. Under PA 121 of 1993, parents and guardians have the right to receive

prior notification of such applications, if desired.

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day the School receives a request for access.
- 2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education record that the parent or eligible student believes is inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.
- 3. The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests.
- 4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the School to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are:

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Pursuant to federal law, a student's legal parent or guardian may refuse to allow the District to disclose any or all of the directory information outlined in Board of Education policy #8330 upon written notification to the District within 30 days after receipt of this public notice.
