Superintendent's Message

Dear Holton Families:

One year ago in the March Know Your Schools article, I shared with the community the various services and supports we rapidly put in place as our schools were forced to close due to the pandemic. This was a time of uncertainty and worry. As I reflect on this historical year, I continue to be incredibly proud of our community. Together we provided food for families with our Food Service and Transportation Departments and the Hand2Hand Program. The parent and teacher partnership had to grow to support continued learning for our kids. Area businesses donated food and resources to help our community. Our community partners stepped up to provide ongoing mental health support to our students. Teachers, support staff, custodians, bus drivers, food service staff, and administrators have demonstrated incredible flexibility as we have responded to this public health crisis. This has been a challenging year. I remain incredibly proud of this community and hopeful that even better days are ahead. Together we can overcome anything!



The arrival of warmer weather and robins are sure signs that spring is underway. There are several updates I want to share as we begin this very busy time of year.

SPRING BREAK: Spring Break is April 2 - April 11. We will continue to provide meals during this time. Please sign up at: <https://forms.gle/XLe57wD87CPhNDYAA>. Meals will be delivered on April 5. Also, if you plan to travel for spring break, please be mindful of the CDC travel recommendations <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/travel-during-covid19.html>. International travel will require a two week quarantine. Please keep this in mind as you make any travel arrangements.

KITCHEN REMODELS: Each of our kitchens will be receiving a variety of upgrades this summer. The Elementary kitchen will be getting some updated equipment and redesigned serving areas to increase food preparation space. The Middle and High school kitchen is getting an upgraded cooler, warming equipment, and a new delivery entrance to support secure vendor delivery. The District Services Building kitchen is getting updated equipment and plumbing to provide additional meal options for our preschool and Virtual Academy students. These projects are all being funded through the additional reimbursement we receive through food service. These dollars must be spent on food service projects.

COMMUNITY SURVEY: Each spring we ask our community to complete a survey to help give feedback to the district. We use this survey data to improve our systems and assess the progress we are making on goals. Please complete the survey at: <https://forms.gle/GFfBjt5Hz2DzusiG6>.

SUMMER PROGRAM: We are in the beginning stages of planning our summer school program. This will be a larger, more robust program for our students. The program will include engaging activities that help support increased academic achievement. The program will be eight weeks with meals and transportation provided. We are working with community partners that will provide a variety of experiences including field trips and presentations to help make this program engaging and fun for our learners.

NEXT YEAR: Preliminary plans are underway for next school year. We are working on plans that include smaller class sizes, increased intervention support, and continued pandemic mitigation strategies as required. The pandemic has impacted our students in a wide variety of ways and we will work to provide individually differentiated learning and support to ensure our students have the most opportunities possible for their future.

On a personal note, I have never had so many people tell me "I would not want your job" during this unusual and unprecedented year. My job has been challenging this year. Even though this has been tough (for all of us), I do want to thank you for your support and encouragement. Your encouraging messages, calls, and thoughtful feedback are really appreciated. I'm honored and privileged to serve the community of Holton Public Schools. Even during a pandemic.

Muskegon Community Foundation started a children's savings account program two years ago for all Kindergarten students in Muskegon County. This year they are focusing on having the first and second grade students, who currently have accounts, to deposit

money into their accounts. They have even set up incentives for them including a project in second grade to earn \$5 for their account and a reading challenge for first and second grade students in the month of March where they can also earn \$5. This information was sent home to our first and second grade students earlier in March. All students can participate whether they attend face to face or virtually.

The Kindergarten students this year will be set up with a savings account with \$50 added to it, at the beginning of next school year (along with next year's Kindergarten students). With so many barriers this year, the community foundation chose to hold off until next year with this part. But all students will have their savings account started next fall. With some of our students learning completely virtual, some of our students learning virtual some days, and with a school closure during November and December, we have all had to adjust to the use of more technology. With this, the district has continued to add more technology for our students. This began last Spring when students were learning completely from home. Then this fall additional technology needed to be added to support our students and families.
