Superintendent's Message

Dear Holton Community:

I hope you enjoyed the colorful show Michigan puts on in the fall. This fall seems to be flying by and I can't believe the holiday season will soon be here. There are so many outstanding things that have been happening with our students, staff, and community! Thank you for your continued support of Holton Public Schools! I am incredibly grateful to serve the students, staff, and families of this community. I want to share several updates with you!

Non-Homestead Operating Millage Renewal: In 2024, the Board of Education is planning to ask voters to approve a non-homestead operating millage renewal. This is a renewal of the 18 mills that has previously been levied on commercial property, industrial property and second homes.

Homeowners are not subject to this tax on their primary residency. More information will be sent in 2024 to educate our voters on this request. Thank you for your ongoing support of Holton Public Schools!

Strategic Planning: The District is currently in the process of updating our Strategic Plan which expires at the end of this school year. We are working through a process to collect stakeholder feedback through surveys and focus groups. Please complete the Holton Public Schools Family and Community Survey to help guide our strategic plan and set priorities for the next several years. Cold and Flu Season: We are certainly starting to see cold and flu viruses circulate. To prevent getting sick, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend the following:

- Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects.
- Get vaccinated if you can.

THIRD GRADE FIELD TRIPS

On September 27th, the third grade attended the Muskegon County Water Festival near Lake Michigan at Pioneer County Park. This community-based learning was developed by the Muskegon Conservation District and sponsored by Howmet Aerospace and free to our students! Local water professionals and educators manned six outdoor stations to teach us the importance of our most valuable natural resource, clean fresh water. We saw how water is used in our daily lives (and our native animals), and how water transportation supported the fur trade and lumbering industry. We played a game to learn about the water cycle and how water makes its way around our planet. We used magnifying glasses to identify the small insects that are in our water, and we learned about the damage that can be done by invasive species and pollution. We were also each given a white pine tree to plant at home to learn about conservation efforts. We had great weather and a picnic before we began our afternoon sessions. What a great hands-on learning experience for our kids!

On September 29th, the third grade attended a Muskegon Lumberjacks hockey game. This "Kids' Day" at the arena kicks off the Lumberjacks reading program incentives. Several times throughout the year, the Lumberjacks provide free goodies if kids meet their reading goals. In the past, we've gotten pencils, player cards, water bottles, and mini journals. Another support to our community that the kids appreciate!
