Vaping: Vaping has become a significant issue for kids across the country including our community. According to the American Lung Association nearly 8,000 kids start vaping every day. We are asking families to help us keep these devices out of the hands of our kids and talk to your kids about vaping to prevent a habit from forming. I am asking all of our middle and high school families to talk with your child about vaping if you haven't yet. Visit the American Lung Association's website at https://www.lung.org/quit-smoking/helping-teens-quit/talk-about-vaping/conversation-guide which includes a Coversation Guide that can help parents talk about this issue. The website also describes what vaping devices can look like and what the signs of use are. Thank you for taking the time to help our kids with this issue!

Family Engagement: This year, Mr. Hudson has served as a Family Engagement Specialist and Athletic Director. Putting a focus on family engagement has required time to be spent learning more about high quality family engagement and how to improve school and family partnerships throughout the district. Using Dr. Karen Mapp's work on Family-School Partnerships found at https://organizingengagement.org/models/dual-capacity-building-framework-for-family-school-partnerships/, the district is beginning to implement Dr. Mapp's framework to grow more impactful family engagement. Dr. Mapp identifies several challenges to family engagement within public education including:

For Educators • Have not been exposed to strong examples of family engagement

- Have received minimal training
- May not see partnership as an essential practice
- May have developed deficit mindsets
- For Families
 - Have not been exposed to strong examples of family engagement
 - Have had negative past experiences with schools and educators • May not feel invited to contribute to their children's education
 - May feel disrespected, unheard, and unvalued

We know effective school and family partnerships are critical for student achievement and school improvement. As we engage in this work, I am hopeful that together our school staff and families will develop even better partnerships and we can strive for outcomes where all of our families feel engaged and proud of Holton Public Schools! 

Dr. Marcia McEvoy came to Holton Middle/High School on February 9th, 10th, 23rd, and 24th to work with all Middle/High School students regarding mean and aggressive behavior. Dr. McEvoy is a Licensed Psychologist with decades of experience in helping kids get along. Dr. McEvoy trained students on preventing and responding to mean and aggressive behavior. Her training defined what mean and aggressive behavior is and made it clear those behaviors are not acceptable at Holton Middle/High School. Additionally, students were trained how to respond when other students are mean or aggressive and how to intervene as a bystander. Dr. McEvoy trained all Holton staff in August and held a parent night on February 24th. Part of the training included introducing students to our new Aggression Rubric. The Aggression Rubric is a tool that addresses mean and aggressive behavior with a level system that has progressive consequences for these behaviors. The Aggression Rubric has already been implemented. Our school has worked with Dr. McEvoy for almost ten years and had an Aggression Rubric for several years. The Rubric was effective in reducing mean and aggressive behavior. The Rubric is a tool that will support our continued efforts to ensure Holton Middle/High School is a safe, inviting place where all students feel welcome. 

The week culminated in group project presentations that demonstrated their individual learning and a chance for unstructured exploration of the museum with parents.


