Superintendent's Message

Happy November Holton Families!

It is hard to believe we are approaching the holiday season! I am incredibly proud of our school district! The way we face and overcome adversity, come together during difficult times, and celebrate our successes inspires me daily. Thank you for being a part of this small and mighty family!

Last year, many of you completed our annual survey. We thank you very much for your participation. One theme that emerged from the data and your comments is the need for clear communication. Based on your feedback, we have established Parent Communication Expectations for all teachers

at Holton Public Schools. Because we think it is important for you to know what you can expect from us, here are those expectations:

• Your students' grades can be accessed through Powerschool.

- K-2 Teachers will communicate progress on standards to parents on a monthly basis.
- Assignment/assessment scores/grades will be entered within a week after the due date in grades 3-12.
- Building administrators (grades 6-12) will run a report of Ds and Fs every two weeks to send to parents through email.

• Teachers will communicate with you via phone call, email, text, or other preferred method when they have concerns based on Academics, Attendance, or Behavior.

- Academics- if/when your child fails a summative assessment, is missing multiple or larger assignments
- that have an impact on their grade, or seems to be struggling with the skills he/she needs to be successful.
- Attendance- if/when your child has 3 consecutive unexcused absences.

• Behavior- if/when your child is sent out of the classroom for Level 2 Problem Behaviors (see handbook). Communication from home is also crucial for Holton Public School teachers to do the best job they can in educating your children. Some of the ways we would encourage you to communicate with the school include:

- Keeping your contact information (address, phone number, email address) up to date so that the school can contact you in a timely manner.
- Attending parent teacher conferences.
- Informing the school office when your child needs to be absent.

We are hopeful these changes will help improve our partnership as we work together to support our students! I hope you enjoy the upcoming holiday season! Holton Public Schools is a great place to grow, learn, graduate and succeed!

Parents are encouraged to login to PowerSchool to view those grades now and on a regular basis. I enjoyed visiting with student's parents and guardians and it was great to see so many of you for parent teacher conferences.

With October being College Month, seniors were encouraged to file their FAFSA and begin applying to colleges. They are also working in Xello, our career exploration program, which helps to narrow down career and college choices.

You may not be aware, but for the past several years, we've had a Career Specialist from the MAISD, Mrs. Michelle Kuck, who sets our students up with opportunities to do job shadows and internships. Job Shadows and Internships are both excellent ways to determine if the industry/profession is the best career option before investing a lot of time and money into further training and education.

Job shadows are short term events, usually one day or a part of one day, that can happen multiple times throughout a student's high school career. This makes them a great way for high school students to see a variety of jobs. Internships are semester long opportunities for 11th or 12th graders to have a work experience in a field that aligns with their educational development plan (EDP). Students are placed at a work site and have the time to participate in and observe the work within a given industry, sometimes with the opportunity to rotate through different departments or job functions.
