# Superintendent's Message

I hope you have been able to stay safe and warm as we faced a historical winter weather pattern. I'm hoping for an early spring! We have many exciting things happening in the district. I want to take this opportunity to inform you of some important information in regards to making up snow days, strategic planning development, and bond projects.

This winter weather has been crazy and caused us to close 14 days and one two-hour delay so far! The district has applied for and received the waiver from the state granting us a total of nine forgiven days. We will need to make up 4.5 Days. The legislature continues to work through potential additional forgiveness days. Should this legislative action pass, we will communicate with our families a new plan that meets the requirements of the law. For now, here is our plan for making up these days:
