

Kendra Scanlon Class of 2003 Female Athlete Inductee

Kendra Scanlon graduated from Holton High School in 2003. During her time at Holton High School, Scanlon proved to be an outstanding athlete and student. She was a three sport athlete participating in basketball, volleyball, and softball. As a basketball player, Scanlon made the state record books for blocked shots. In 2002, Scanlon had 15 blocked shots in one game. In 2001 and 2002, Scanlon made state records again for the number of blocked shots in a season with 171 blocks in 2001 and 178 blocks in 2002. She also holds a state record for the number of blocked shots in her career with 439 blocks from 1999-2002.

Scanlon graduated as salutatorian and with her athletic prowess was selected for the Scholar-Athlete Award from the Muskegon Chronicle Muskegon Sports Hall of Fame in 2003. She went on to play collegiate level basketball at Hope College. Scanlon returned to Holton High School as the Varsity Girls Basketball Coach for several years.
