

Ryan Busch Class of 2009 Male Athlete Inductee

Ryan Busch graduated from Holton High School in 2009. As a Football, Basketball, and Baseball athlete Busch quickly became a key player throughout his high school athletic career. In football, Busch was a dominate player on the field playing three years on the varsity team. As one of the captains during his senior year, Busch's six foot six inch, 240 pound frame made him a phenomenal defensive end and key receiver on the offense. Busch was voted all conference twice and all area defensive end first team in 2007 and 2008. Busch's performance on the field caught the eye of college recruits. Busch went on to play for Saginaw Valley State University's football team. At SVSU, Busch earned all-conference honors in 2012 as the Cardinals defensive end.

As a three year varsity basketball player, Busch was also very skilled. Busch was a top scorer and rebounder for the Red Devils averaging 15.2 points per game. Busch earned all-conference honorable mention in 2007 and 2008.

Busch's athleticism extended to the baseball diamond. As a Red Devil baseball player, he was a big hitter and solid pitcher. Busch pitched 2.97 E.R.A. and had a batting average of .421 his senior year scoring 33 runs and 35 RBIs. This earned him All Conference Honorable Mention. In addition to his athletic skills, Busch earned First Team Academic All District in baseball for his commitment to high academic performance in the classroom.

Busch earned his Bachelor's Degree from Saginaw Valley State University and his Master's Degree from Grand Valley State University in Physician Assistant Studies.
