

MDHHS continues to require school districts to report on COVID-19 cases. Below is this week's COVID-19 Dashboard which includes new school associated COVID-19 cases and the number of students and staff in quarantine. Because of the district's masking policy, multiple students were able to avoid quarantine and remain in school.



We recommend taking action to help limit the spread of COVID-19 including:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) while indoors.
- Practice social distancing (maintaining a distance of 6 feet apart).
- Practice frequent handwashing (using soap for 20 seconds or hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol).
