Dear Holton Community:

I hope your summer has been filled with opportunities to enjoy West Michigan and soak in the sunny weather! We are getting very excited for our school year to start! We had a busy summer hiring new members to our team, several facility upgrades, and planning for the school year. I have a few updates to share with you as we approach the start of the school year:

District Open House: Please join us at our Open House on August 20, 2025 from 4PM-7PM. We will be hosting a community cookout and will have many of our community partners available with school supplies and other goodies. Hackley Community Care will be at the Open House

with their Mobile Dental Unit. More information will be coming about scheduling an appointment soon. I hope to see you at the Open House!

We are still in the process of hiring a few more positions. Please join me in welcoming our new staff and congratulating staff members in new positions! They are all very excited to support our students and families!

Before School Child Care: Enrollment is available for our Before School Daycare for Preschool- 6th Grade students. This is operated by Lighthouse Learning Centers, a program of White Lake Area Community Education. The Before School Daycare provides childcare at the District Services Building from 6:30AM until the start of the school day. You can learn more about this program and enroll by contacting Susan Mulvey at (231) 893-1000 ext. 2510 or susanmulvey@wlace.org. Additional options are available for snow days, early release days, and school breaks based on interest and enrollment. Please contact Susan if you are interested.

After School Program - Project FOCUS: Project Focus will be returning this year with some new staff! This program is great for students to receive extra academic support in grades K-8th. Program participants receive a snack, meal, and free transportation. This year, the Elementary Program will be changing. There will now be a morning session from 7:30AM until the start of the school day. K-5 students can ride the first bus route and participate in the program. The after school program at the elementary will now run from the end of the school day until 5:15PM, the same as the Middle School program. You can sign your child up for this program at our District Open House on August 20 from 4-7PM or by contacting the Elementary Program Coordinator, Michelle Beyer, at: mbeyer@ holton.k12.mi.us. Project Focus is still in the process of hiring a new Middle School Program Coordinator. If you are interested in signing up for the middle school or have questions about the program, contact Danielle Siegel at: dsiegel@truenorthservices.org.

Nontraditional Enrollment Options: If you are not enrolled with Holton Public Schools, we know some families and students prefer other options for a school experience instead of a traditional one. Holton Public Schools has several options for enrollment and other flexible ways to enroll that give families the opportunity to experience school based on individual preferences. These options include several virtual choices including the Holton Virtual Academy for 6-12th grade students, Muskegon County Virtual Academy for K-12th grade students, or a blended enrollment where a portion of the day is virtual and some of the day is in person learning. We can work with homeschool families to enroll for one or two classes and homeschool the additional part of the day. If you are not enrolled with Holton Public Schools but would be interested in learning more about these options, please visit https://www.holtonschools.com/for-parents/parents/enrollment/nontraditional-enrollment/ or call any of our offices. We can discuss how the District can support you and your child far beyond a traditional school experience.

School Resource Officer Support: Deputy Reiley will start the school year again as our School Resource Officer. We are working to sustain this position for this school year by extending the existing partnership with Blue Lake Township, Cedar Creek Township, and Holton Public Schools. We will then seek out another multi-year agreement with our Townships and the Muskegon County Sheriff's Department. Deputy Reiley has been a tremendous support for our community and we are hopeful this partnership continues for years to come. Deputy Reiley has a cell phone dedicated to our students, families, and community as another way to report safety concerns or ask for help. The number is (231) 880-5974 which can be called or receive text messages. I am very thankful for these partnerships that allow for our district to have Deputy Reiley serve our school district!

Counseling and Health Services: We are grateful for our partnerships with Health West and Hackley Community Care. HealthWest has School Based Clinician Juanita Westerbeek ready to support students and families. Hackley Community Care has two clinicians, Rhonda Byrne at Holton Elementary and Hannah Brown at Holton Middle and High School. Both Rhonda and Hannah are looking forward to continuing to work with students and families. Hackley Community Care's School Nurse, Amanda Giddings, will be returning to support healthcare services for our students. Learn more about accessing services from HealthWest or Hackley Community Care by visiting them during the District Open House or contact the building offices.

Turf Replacement Project: Our turf replacement project is scheduled to be complete in time for our first home football game on August 28. The new turf replaces the original turf that was installed in 2006. I am grateful for the team of contractors and engineers who worked hard this summer to get this project done. 

PBIS at Holton Elementary

At Holton Elementary, we are proud to promote a positive school culture through our PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) framework, centered around our **RED Expectations**:

• Respect • Effort • Dependability

At the start of the school year, all students are explicitly taught what these expectations look like in different areas of the school—including classrooms, hallways, bathrooms, the cafeteria, and the playground. Students will participate in activities and discussions that help them understand how to model respectful, responsible behavior in each setting. Throughout the first couple of weeks, we ask that you partner with us by taking a moment to ask your student(s) what our RED expectations are for each location to help reinforce their learning here at school.

Holton Elementary Offers Two Kindergarten Options for 2025–2026

Holton Elementary will once again offer **two enrollment options** for incoming Kindergarten students for the 2025–2026 school year:

- Traditional Kindergarten
- Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

With rising academic expectations, some children benefit from an extra year to grow socially, emotionally, and academically before entering a traditional classroom. Holton's **Transitional Kindergarten** program provides that opportunity through a **two-year experience**:

- In the first year, students are part of a play-based, developmentally appropriate classroom that nurtures curiosity, confidence, and foundational skills.
- In the second year, students move into a traditional academic Kindergarten setting, better prepared for success.

This program is ideal for children who would benefit from additional time to develop school readiness skills in a supportive, engaging environment.

If your child will be **five years old by December 1, 2025**, and you're interested in enrolling in either Kindergarten option, please contact the Holton Elementary office at **231-821-1826**. We are excited to welcome our newest Red Devils to a great start in their educational journey!

Hero Squads

Every student at Holton Elementary is a member of a **Hero Squad** — a mixed-age group led by two staff members and including students from all grade levels. Hero Squads meet twice a month to focus on **social-emotional learning** (SEL) through structured lessons and engaging, hands-on activities.

Older students help mentor younger peers, building a sense of connection and community across the school. On Hero Squad days, students proudly wear their **Holton Hero Squad t-shirts**, fostering school spirit and unity.

We ask families to partner with us to ensure students wear their Hero Squad t-shirt and ask them what they discussed during Hero Squads.

At Holton Elementary, PBIS helps us create a safe and supportive learning environment where all students can thrive. We are proud of our RED expectations and the incredible growth we see in our students every day!

Elementary Pick-Up & Drop-Off Procedures

All elementary school pick-up and drop-off will take place in the **parent parking lot loop**.

• Morning Drop-Off:

Begins at 8:40 AM each school day. Parents may pull up along the sidewalk, where students can safely exit the vehicle and enter the building through the far gym door. A staff member will be present to monitor and ensure student safety during this time.

• Afternoon Pick-Up:

Occurs in the same location. Parents should pull into the loop, follow the line along the sidewalk, and wait for a staff member to ask which student you are picking up. Continue to move forward as directed. Staff will escort students from the gym to their vehicles.

• Important Reminders:

Please drive slowly, stay alert for students and other vehicles, and remain patient to help ensure the safety of everyone in the lot.

• Changes to Dismissal Plans:

If there is a change to your child's regular dismissal routine (e.g., switching from the bus to parent pick-up), please **call the office by 1:00 PM**. Changes made after 1:00 PM should be limited to **emergency situations only** to ensure a smooth and accurate dismissal process.

HOLTON HERO TICKETS



We ask families to partner with us by donating small items to help us "stock up our store." Please bring any donations to the elementary office.

Zero the Hero Recognition

Each month, students who consistently follow our school expectations and do not receive any office or reflection zone referrals are honored as "Zero the Hero" recipients. These students are celebrated with special rewards—such as fun activities or surprise treats—as a way to recognize and reinforce their positive behavior.

We ask families to partner with us by regularly reviewing and reinforcing our RED Expectations: Respect, Effort, and Dependability. These expectations are outlined in the student handbook and will be featured in upcoming newsletters as well.





MEDICATION POLICY

Parents are to come to the office and request medication forms. These forms must be completed by the parent/guardian and by the child's physician. Parents/guardians must bring the completed forms along with the medication their child needs, to the school office. Students are NOT allowed to bring medications to school. A student in possession of drugs (illegal OR prescription) will be disciplined according to language located in the handbooks. The offices will be open for those parents who wish to take care of this before school starts.

MEDIA RELEASE:

The Holton community is hereby notified that the school often publishes for public view the names of Holton Public School students. The purpose varies and may involve honor rolls, attendance lists, special awards, athletic rosters, etc. If for any reason you do not wish your child's name to be published, please contact your school office immediately. NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY:

This option extends to the refusal to disclose a student's directory information to the United States Armed Forces recruiters. Parents or guardians wishing to withhold this information must submit a signed written request to the Board of Education through the high school counseling office. Written requests must be submitted to the HHS counseling office.

ASBESTOS INFORMATION

The regulations of federal law require that local educational agencies annually notify various groups, including building occupants or their legal guardians, regarding asbestos containing materials in school district buildings and plans related thereto. RIGHT TO KNOW

- 3) The teacher's college degree(s), major(s), and field(s) of discipline, as well as any graduate degree or certification that he or she may have earned.

In addition to this information about your child's teacher(s), you may also request this information about any paraprofessional who provides Title I services to your child.

REQUEST FOR NOTIFICATION OF PESTICIDE APPLICATION

Holton Public Schools either contracts with private vendors or applies its own pesticides within district facilities and on their grounds. Under PA 121 of 1993, parents and guardians have the right to receive prior notification of such applications, if desired.

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day the School receives a request for access.
- The right to request the amendment of the student's education record that the parent or eligible student believes is inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.
- 3. The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests.

PATHWAYS TO POTENTIAL
