Thank you for a fantastic school year! I hope your summer is filled with joyful memories, time to read great books, and all the beauty West Michigan has to offer. As we move into summer break, here are a few important updates:

Academic Success!

We're incredibly proud of the academic growth our students have shown this year! Based on benchmark assessments from NWEA Measures of Academic Progress:

- **Math:** 100% of assessed grade levels showed growth from Fall to Spring, and half exceeded national norms.
- **Reading:** 83% of grade levels showed growth, with 33% outperforming national norms.

While we continue working to improve achievement for all students, it's important to pause and celebrate these gains. Congratulations to our students, staff, and families for their hard work and progress!

2025-26 Enrollment:

We continue to enroll students for the 2025-2026 School Year. We have a variety of options for enrollment. 
