## Superintendent's Message

Dear Holton Community:

Fall is such a beautiful time of year! I hope you were able to take time to enjoy the colorful display we get to enjoy in West Michigan. Soon we will be entering the holiday season and get to give special celebration to being thankful. The community of Holton Public Schools is certainly on my list of what I am grateful for! I am incredibly grateful to serve the students, staff, and families of this community. There are so many outstanding things happening across the district! Here are a few updates for you!



Turf Replacement Project: The time has come to replace our turf field. The first game played on the turf was in 2006. With a general life span of ten years, our turffield has maintained wonderfully. Our recent Impact Assessment indicates that the playing surface has become very hard and to ensure the safety of everyone who uses the field, it is time to complete this project. The turf replacement will begin in June with an anticipated completion in the summer. The total cost of the project is expected to be over \$1 million. Approximately \$350,000 of the funding for the project will come from set aside savings over the last several years and the remaining portion will come from a non-voted bond approved by the Board of Education. This will result in a payment the District will pay each year until the project is paid off. There will be no increase in taxes for the community due to this project. The District is able to afford this due to paying off existing debt from the QZAB which was a prior bond debt from 2007. Our turf field and stadium was an amazing investment by the community over 15 years ago. The turf field allows

for our football players, marching band, track and field, cheerleaders, PE classes, and other users to have a safe and accessible playing surface that can be used all year. The turf will include updated graphics, stronger lines, preset marks for use by baseball and softball teams, and improved turf technology including a shockpad to reduce the wear of the field and improve player safety. We look forward to this project and that our beautiful stadium will be available for our school community for years to come.



QZAB Debt Paid! In 2007, Holton Public Schools participated in a Sinking Fund opportunity with the state which provided \$1.7 Million to the District to invest in energy efficient upgrades. These funds were used to pay for LED lighting, new appliances, and improvements to our heating systems. The District has paid these funds back since then spending approximately \$114,000 each year. In August, we made the last payment on this debt. This has reduced the debt load of the District by \$1.7 million dollars! It has also freed up funds for us to make payments toward the turf replacement.

Bond Refunding: The Board has initiated the process for bond refunding. This process allows for the District to consolidate debt and save taxpayers money. We currently have three outstanding bonds including two bonds from the 2015 bond refunding and the 2018 School Improvement Bond. Should market conditions be favorable, the District will move forward with consolidating this debt and save taxpayer dollars on these debt obligations. The District's financial stability is a responsibility the Board of Education takes seriously and being good stewards of the resources we are provided by the community is a high

Cold and Flu Season: We are certainly experiencing the cold and flu viruses that are circulating. To prevent getting sick, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend the following:



The high school and middle school Hope Squads have been hard at work bringing awareness to mental health resources, connecting with the community, and identifying ways to build stronger connections with peers in school. This school year they have participated in storytime at the Holton Public Library with stories focused on friendship and working together. They also observed national suicide prevention day by bringing awareness to the semicolon, a way to represent and share personal strength and to overcome internal struggle. They were also able to make students aware of the mental health resources available to them within their building and nationally. Hope Squad has also participated in restorative practices training, which is a learning approach that works to build relationships and positive community within the school. Hope Squad is hoping that this will allow students to be able to better manage peer conflict and build peer connections more readily. They're eager to bring more resources to the school and continue to build connections within the community and amongst their peers.

## Fentanyl Fathers Presentation

Middle/High Holton School welcomed Fentanyl Fathers into the building on September 25th to present to the students about the dangers of fentanyl. Fentanyl Fathers is a group of bereaved fathers that have lost children to fentanyl. Their goal is to



speak to students at every secondary school in America so that other fathers do not have to experience the grief they have. As many parents are aware, fentanyl is an extremely potent synthetic opiate that has sadly claimed many lives in this country. For some time now, fentanyl has been mixed into other street drugs and is causing a significant amount of overdoses. One shocking fact presented was that 8 out of 10 pills sold by drug dealers now contain fentanyl. With the extreme risks posed to students and their families by fentanyl, the Middle and High School staff thought this presentation was something the students needed to hear. The presentation was informative and powerful. Parents, please make sure you are speaking to your children about the risks that fentanyl and other drugs pose. Make the message clear: do not take anything from anyone that wasn't prescribed to you!

Here at school we have completed our first marking period, our first round of benchmark assessments, and have settled into our routines. We are excited to have a new mentor program



## Ms. Sundberg's Third Grade Students are Authors



Ms. Sundberg's third-grade classroom completed a big project sponsored by the Muskegon Area District Library. During the first week of October, they worked with Mrs. Jodi Juergens (our MAISD literacy coach) to develop and design our class book. They had started to read the Peanuts Countdown to Halloween (a daily story for each day in October), so they decided to write about Lola Llama (our class mascot) and her use of a Halloween Time Machine. Students were inspired to use the concept of a time machine based on an earlier book that they read in September--Llama Unleashes the Alpacalypse by Jonathan Stutzman. So students partnered up, created our stories and illustrations, and finally finished our book! They have turned the draft of their book over to MADL for them to make into an actual hardcover book. The library is making two copies--one for the classroom and one that will be available for checkout at our Holton Library Branch.

Ms. Sundberg's class attended a student author celebration at the Holton Library Branch on Tuesday evening, November 12th, at 6:00 p.m. The finished books were presented to the class and the library. As the final step, they traveled to Muskegon Heights Academy High School on November 14th to meet author, Yuyi Morales. MADL gave them her newest book, Dreamers, for their classroom library. There were other third grade classes from around the county at this event. Third graders at Holton were lucky to be able to attend! This has been a worthwhile project that has inspired students to practice more of their writing skills in the future!

## Muskegon County Road Commission Visit
