Superintendent's Message

Dear Holton Community:

Michigan's color show never disappoints! I hope you were able to take time to enjoy the beautiful fall we are lucky to experience here in West Michigan. I'm looking forward to the holiday season and celebrating all that we are grateful for. The community of Holton Public Schools is certainly on my list of what I am grateful for! I am incredibly thankful to serve the students, staff, and families of this community.



<u>District Celebrations</u>: There are so many things to celebrate this fall! Students across the district have had the opportunity to go on field trips including the John Ball Zoo, college visits, Lakeshore Museum, and Heritage Farms. Students have been engaged in lots of hands-on learning including exploring outdoor navigation, learning construction and woodworking, studying historical documents, and conducting science experiments. Our student athletes completed great seasons with several students qualifying for MHSAA state finals in golf and cross country. Our staff are working together to implement strong instructional practices, getting trained in new curricular resources, and building meaningful relationships with our students and families.

<u>Turf Replacement Project</u>: The Turf Replacement Project is officially complete after a few final adjustments to the installation. We held a Turf Reopening Ceremony in August. The Muskegon Area Intermediate School District Communications Team created a video highlighting the various features of the field. <u>Cold and Flu Season:</u> We have already had a couple cold and flu viruses circulate. To prevent getting sick, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend the following:


